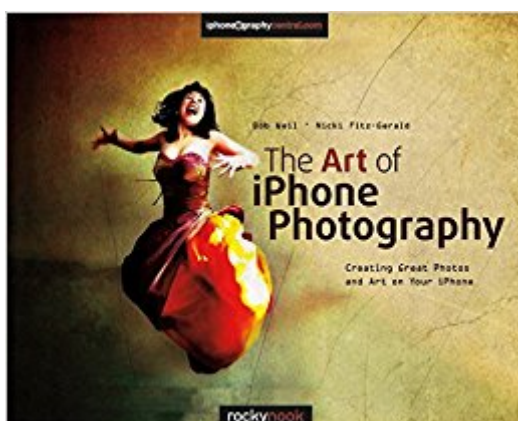

Other books are very helpful and worth having, i.e. Dan Burkholder, but they only tell you about how that person works with apps. This book tells you how MANY photographers work on their photographs. The photos cover a wide range. To me, some are brilliant and some just good and interesting, but the instructions are detailed and, sometimes, the photographer gives you instructions on using a particular app, not just how it was used in the photo but how to use it generally. This is definitely the best book out on how to work with the iPhone (and I didn't get a review copy) and I have several other books.

This book is for the advanced photographer. I wanted something to give me simple easy clues on how to use my iPhone as a camera. A waste of my money but might be perfect for a more advanced person. See classes offered on how to use your iPhone with simple little things you might not know but is there a book out there that tells you these things?
