

I really liked this book, and I wish I had bought it sooner. I'm a soon-to-be junior, and I seriously regret not buying this when I was a freshman. It provides good advice that starts from what you

should do during your freshman year - that definitely would've helped me become more organized and make better decisions during my first year, but even now, it's incredibly useful. Also, it makes planning for college seem fun - almost. :D The only reason I'm giving this four stars is the condition of this book. It wasn't listed as used, and it doesn't seem to be, but it's in very bad condition. This book is spiral-bound, and for mine, the inside of the book wasn't correctly glued onto the cover. WTF. So when I flip through it, the pages seem like they're about to fall out of the book. Also, it's a thick stack of good-quality paper stuffed and crammed into a small cover, which makes flipping pages very hard, and unlike other spiral-bound books/notebooks, you can't actually make the book flat. I thought being spiral-bound was one of the pros of this book, but it turned out to be a con. Talk about disappointment. But aside from the condition and appearance, the content is amazing, so I would still strongly recommend this book to anyone who's considering buying it - you honestly won't regret it.

Jaye Fenderson takes the overwhelming process of finding, applying to, deciding on, and financing a college education exactly what it should be for every girl - full of excitement, anticipation, and adventure!
