

Brennan Manning spent his life and ministry helping others experience the unconditional love of Jesus Christ. A recovering alcoholic and former Franciscan priest, his own spiritual journey took him down a variety of paths, all of them leading to the profound reality of God's irresistible

grace. His ministry responsibilities varied greatly — from teacher, to minister to the poor, to solitary reflective. As a writer, Brennan Manning is best known as the author of the contemporary classics, *The Ragamuffin Gospel*, *Abba's Child*, *Ruthless Trust*, *The Importance of Being Foolish*, *Patched Together*, and *The Furious Longing of God*. John Blase (pronounced "Blaze") is a writer/editor living along Colorado's Front Range. He currently serves as a developmental editor for David C. Cook Publishing, working hand in hand with such authors as Leonard Sweet, Frank Viola, Francis Chan, and most recently, a very close collaborative effort with Brennan Manning on the book, *The Furious Longing of God*. He served as a pastor for thirteen years in Southern Baptist and non-denominational churches in Texas, Arkansas, and Colorado, and for forty-two years, he's proudly been a pastor's son. John is the author of eight books with NavPress including *Living the Questions* and *Living the Letters* Bible study series. He also co-authored and edited several books with NavPress like the *Worldviews* reference book (TH1NK), *Real Life Stuff for Couples* and *The Message Children's Bible*. What better place is there to be than smack dab in the middle of God's love? In their new book, which boasts that phrase as the title, Brennan Manning and John Blase share that truth with kids while telling a unique story about Willie Juan and his wife Ana. Set in a little Mexican village called Hopi, *Smack Dab in the Middle of God's Love* explores how Willie Juan and his wife share their lives with the children of the village. Vibrant illustrations help paint the picture of their loving exchanges with the children, showing them walking, teaching, feeding and encouraging in an effort to show them that they are always smack dab in the middle of God's love. My thoughts: I love the title of this book. Like the first page says, "smack-dab" is a great word! I also love the message the authors ultimately convey. They encourage us to be active in our communities, involved in the lives of children and passionate about reminding them that they are always in the center of God's love. The setting of the Mexican villages gives it a multi-cultural appeal that is missing in so many Christian children's books. I was thrilled with the illustrator's depiction of children in varying shades of the rainbow (although I wondered if such a village would actually be home to the little cuties with the blonde hair). I thought the story was well told, however I had to re-read the first two pages a few times. It seemed like a page was missing, as the book went from an explanation of the title on one

page and a discussion of "the man and his wife" on the next. I felt as if I'd missed the page that actually introduced this man and his wife, but the introduction came a few sentences later and the rest of the story flowed smoothly. This book is a keeper for us, largely because of the illustrations and its display of cultural diversity. As I mentioned, I don't think my kids get to see enough of this in the stories they're reading about the Lord. The authors successfully deliver the message that God's love is a love big enough to hold us all. It's a message that cannot be shared enough and the authors manage to share it a unique and heart-warming way. I received a review copy of the book from Tommy Nelson.

Smack Dab in the Middle of God's Love by Brennan Manning and John Blase is a beautifully illustrated children's book about God's love for each one of us. Willie Juan and Anna couldn't have children of their own but their house is full of children. They show them all God's love and share their delicious sopapillas. As the title suggests, by the end of the story, all the children come to realize that they are "smack dab in the middle of God's Love." What a wonderful phrase! I found myself thinking that phrase several times after reading this book a couple of times. This is Brennan Manning's first children's book. He is a popular speaker and author who specializes in sharing God's love for His children to all his audiences. I read this book with my 9 year old son. The book is just a little young for him as it is suggested for ages 4 to 8. At first he rolled his eyes since it wasn't a chapter book. However, once he read it with me he said still enjoyed the theme of the story and he especially liked the brightly colored illustrations. By the end of the book, he was smiling and he said he would give it at least 4 stars even though it was a little young for him. I downloaded this book for Kindle. However we just used the Kindle app and read it on the computer so we could see the illustrations in all their bright colors. I would definitely want to buy this book in the hard copy to share with any other children unless I had a colored e-reader.
