

I've been a fan of Annelie Wendeberg since her first book, "The Devil's Grin," the first novel of a trilogy of Anna Kronberg and Sherlock Holmes set in Victorian England. I discovered this novel while exploring what else she may have written. "1/2986" is Wendeberg's first Dystopian or Sci-Fi novel; it is an interesting novel, one that makes you think (sorry. Early Warning: "1/2986," as most of her novels, does contain some scenes that are disturbing: some language, non-explicit sex, and some graphic violence. Regardless, if the warning does not bother you, and you are a fan of the dystopian genre and of excellent characterization - especially of a strong female character who is repressed or damaged in some way - then this is a book for you! As with most Dystopian novels, there has been a great catastrophe; the Great Pandemic has wiped out most of the Earth's population; it is estimated that only "1/2986" of the population has survived. Now, nearly seventy years after the Great Pandemic, remnants of humanity are scattered high in the mountains, far from the deadly disease that wiped out ten billion lives. While everyone else claws for survival, young Micka cuts lines and numbers into her skin. Until one day, a stranger enters her village and offers her an opportunity as an apprentice. And now the story really begins to unfold as young Micka struggles to learn and to survive. As an author, Wendeberg is able to develop strong characters, especially her female characters, as here with young Micka. She also has an ability to portray a very credible female protagonist who is very human, and yet who are at the same time repressed by society (or something else) and in a sense, damaged in some way. Often it is the evil of society or the world which represses them; regardless, they struggle onward. Wendeberg keeps a balance between her disturbed characters and reality; she develops a plot that is intriguing as it is suspenseful. She is a strong young writer who I encourage anyone to read.

Don't know if 'enjoy' is the right word, but I liked this unusual tale and found it easy to keep reading in order to learn what comes next.

The story grabs you from the very beginning and allows the narrative to gradually explain the living

conditions and culture of the setting. I've already bought and read the additional two installments that continue the story and look forward to more!

Recommend reading all three installments of the trilogy straight through. Although considered feminine YA fiction, as an adult male I found the story, characters and bleak dystopian backdrop most enthralling. Order now and begin reading.

I got this kindle book free and was so caught up in the story that I immediately bought Fog, the sequel. I found the storyline and characters intriguing. Background information is revealed throughout the book, so I slowly learned more and more about the people, their world and how they came to be as they are. Now I'm anxious to immediately move on to the next book!

I wasn't aware this was a series when I first picked up this book, but now I'm glad that it is - I need to know what happens to Micka! What a phenomenal journey she has gone through. I'm looking forward to the rest of it.
