

This is a wonderful collection of short stories where each of the main characters is an "Officer" in some form or another, whether that is an officer of the law, an officer on board a ship or an Officer of a different type of Military organisation (there are a few). Each of these stories are not only exceptionally well written, but they are so extraordinarily well

created that you will find that you lose hours as you are travel from one tale to the next. Following is a short review of each of the individual stories contained in *The Officer*. *The Officer* is a clever story following Dave a Security Officer aboard a space station in which he is understaffed and overworked. The Station is also over run by a criminal element and by a very large number of thieves. Dave has an unlikely alliance with a crime lord that runs the station, allowing him to keep an uneasy peace aboard the station, within certain boundaries. However, this all changes when the station and everyone are threatened by a bomb. This story shows how uneasy alliances can be used to different advantages, and how also things can change so quickly. Shaw's characters are brilliant as is his station background and the storyline. This is a fantastic start *The Officer* and sets a very high standard for the remaining short stories. *Patchworker 2.0* is M Pax's *Patchworker* who can connect with AI in a future in which the Earth has been basically destroyed, and we live below. The AI's control a lot of life, so the Patchworkers are the key to life in a lot of ways and are quite special. On this particular job, Evalyn discovers that several other Patchworkers have been killed and reduced to biomatter and left for dead, and she is going to the last place they went, to connect with an AI that was their last job. Will she survive? This had some really brilliant twists in it, the story itself is incredibly clever, and M Pax continues to show that she has a rather unusual impact on the Sci-Fi world, but certainly one that is worth reading. *Totaled* by Benjamin Douglas is a 5/5. This was a fascinating story, slow to get moving, but this was part of the allure of the story itself. It follows an ageing XO on board a ship, Dolridge, a ship that is patrolling the Kuiper belt, and has been for so long that the crew has become complacent and totally disinterested. All except new recruit Caspar that is. Caspar is a new arrival and as such is full of beans, and still ready to go. When the ship suddenly starts having strange issues, sensor ghosts, weird alarms and potential stowaways, it becomes apparent that something might not be right. This is a very clever short story, the main characters are exceptionally well written, and it has an outstanding series of plot lines that lead us to the close one that leads to events in a new series *The Lunar Gambit*. This short was so good I went and grabbed the Authors book, well worth the read. *Lucky Star* is A R Knight's *A R Knight* is 3/5. Whilst there was nothing overly wrong with this story, it left me kind of

wanting. I enjoyed it, but given the quality of some of the other works in this collection, I did not find it as interesting. There is basically an agent and her robot sent to collect a man and return him to an organisation. The man has been detained by a criminal organisation for an incredibly large sum of owed money. How does said women and her robot companion get the man out and complete her job? This has been done before, it was great to see a female lead, but there was nothing overly original, standout or unique about the story. But it was thoroughly enjoyable. I love anthologies. They give me a chance to explore new authors without needing to make a big

commitment. Even if a few of the offerings don't live up to my expectations, there's always a treasure there somewhere that makes it worthwhile. I was given an ARC copy of this book by one of the authors so I thought I'd read his story and maybe one or two more and give you my general impressions. I started with the first story ... and then the next, and before I knew it the % counter in the bottom corner of my Kindle said 100%. There is not a bad story in this whole collection. You'll find everything from princes to programmers, space station gangsters to alien spiders, all lovingly crafted by an international cast of great SF authors. Unless you're a serious science fiction junkie, you probably won't recognize most of the writers whose work appears here, but I'd be surprised if you don't find at least a few that you'll want to become more familiar with. I'll certainly be checking out a lot of the other offerings mentioned in each story's "about the author" and that, after all, is what anthologies are all about.
