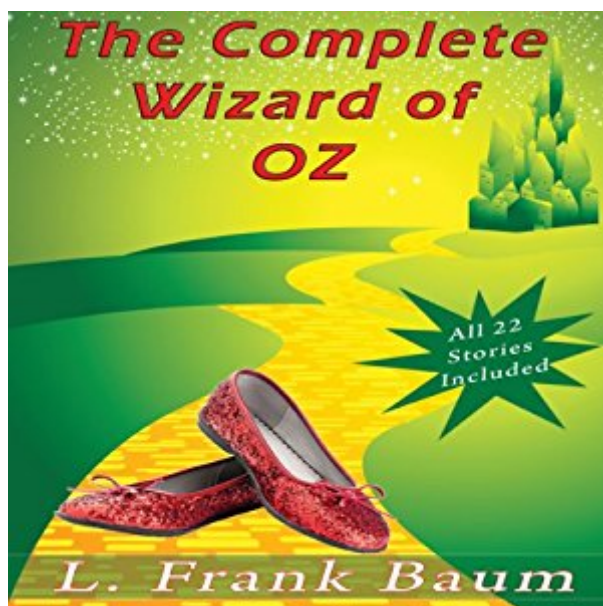

I was in the processing of downloading each of the free Kindle versions of the Oz books when I came across this version. This version is currently .95, and for someone who is unfamiliar with the Oz books and what order to read them in this price is worth paying. I went to the internet to figure out what order the books were in, but knew that I would never remember the order while I was reading and would have to look it up each time. This Kindle version has all the books laid out in their proper order, with a nice table of contents. The ToC doesn't just list each book, it is actually laid out by chapter. So, for instance, you can jump ahead to chapter 14 of The Wonderful Wizard of Oz - "The Winged Monkeys." If you're worried about getting a properly formatted version, just be sure to download the newest version. Next to the book image and title, there is a "Formats" section with a + Drop-Down box. I chose Kindle Version June 21, 2010 and it is properly formatted. I am very much looking forward to reading this.

How anyone could possibly complain about getting the original "The Wonderful Wizard of Oz" and the succeeding 13 sequels with one click for 95 cents is beyond me. My 10 year old read a

paperback copy of The Wonderful Wizard of Oz" as part of an over-the-summer reading assignment prior to entering the 5th grade. He enjoyed it very much, as I did a long time ago> When I told him that there were 2 or 3 sequels, he was surprised ("Why didn't they make them into movies too, Dad?") and asked for them. When I looked them up on *I* was surprised to find out that there were 13 of them and that I could get them all for my Kindle for \$0.95. Click and I had them, and Jacob has read the first 3 or 4, and now I have to fight him for my Kindle. A better buy you will never make.Highly RecommendedJM Tepper

Okay. I bit the bullet and tried the FULL version of this book after my scathing review of the sample. I returned the FULL version for a refund and deleted the sample.Other than ONE pencil sketch at the very beginning of a VERY few books, there just aren't any illustrations. And it seems even the Cover Art is now missing (the sample at least had that one piece of cover art).So I still stand by my review below, but it now includes all problems listed to the FULL version, except the formatting seems to be improved.After reading all the bad reviews, I decided to try the SAMPLE. This review is JUST on the SAMPLE. I have a Kindle Touch, your Kindle experience may vary. As of 7 February 2013, the formatting is still missing and none of the illustrations are there. I agree with earlier reviews that where the illustrations are supposed to be, the book just says "IMAGE". There is cover art and one small illustration before the beginning of the book. Other than that, not a thing.As for the formatting, the book is a hodge-podge of double, triple, and quadruple line breaks. Sentences start with page numbers. And paragraphs have jagged line breaks in them.There's a supposedly better version "The Complete Wizard of Oz Collection (With Active Table of Contents)" which also does NOT have illustrations (but doesn't claim to) for the same price (99 cents).And the Delphi \$3 version's one review states it also has no pictures.What the heck guys?!? Either they have illustrations or they don't! Get the picture? We don't.Personally, I'm holding off purchasing and writing complaints until gets this mess fixed.I realize it's only \$1, but the the sample sent was fairly unreadable.If you just want the stories with no illustrations, ALL the books are available for free separately or in a set, or you can try another version.If you want the illustrations (as I do), you'll either have to find a print version or wait.

WhenI first saw this item was available, I jumped at it. I figured that 14 great stories for \$0.95 was a bargain worth having. I got it, even though it did not have a linked Table Of Contents (TOC), and enjoyed it despite it's having it's share of typos. Just recently, I was notified that there is now an updated version with the typos fixed, and with a TOC added. Best of all, It was a free update for me,

as I had purchased the earlier version. I just downloaded it. The Complete Wizard of Oz Collection (With Active Table of Contents). Once again Kindle proves to have Superior Customer Service. This work is a classic worth owning...especially if you have kids, or grandkids, around.

This Review is not about the writing of the books, The Oz books are classic children's literature and great literature at that. Mainly I am reviewing the Kindle version. I read this book on my Kindle Paperwhite. It reads just fine, but is often glitchy in many ways. The way the Table of Contents is laid out works but is confusing. Often you cannot tell the book title from chapters or really pick out the different books. It'll list an all-caps title with the same title in lower case beneath, confusing where one starts and the other begins. When you click on a book it opens up the chapter titles but it also still has open the titles of the other books which means you sometimes need to scroll through a lot of titles to get where you want to be and can hit the wrong title by mistake easily. There are also many, many typos. It's totally worth the 99 cents for the Kindle version. The books are great! But it's not perfect by any means.

Where were the pictures? Without John Neil's fabulous and fantastic illustrations, these are just stories. Great stories, to be sure (and not just for kids), but the words alone are only part of the magic of Oz. Recommend spending the dollar or two for each individual title in the Kindle store--these have the illustrations, in all their glory! Otherwise, you are going to have to imagine for yourself what, exactly, the Gump looks like--and then try to describe it to the child to whom you are reading this book.
