This is a children's book for grown-ups. It is a synopsis, or Cliffs Notes, of the whole bible. "No child could possibly grasp the true depth here", was my initial thought upon reading it. Then I remembered the words of Ralph Venning, a Puritan from the 1600's, who wrote about scripture, "It is deep enough for an elephant to swim in, yet shallow enough for a lamb to wade in." Yes! Children can and will wade happily in this book! They will be captured by the illustration, and enjoy reading again the stories they already know. Also, they will come away from it understanding that the bible is one Big Story - not just a collection of little ones. And adults? Reminded here of the amazing power and "God-ness" of God, they may well swim in the biblical sea of sheer grace. Here are a few of my favorite quotes "God kept his promises. He blessed the whole lot of them despite themselves." "God rounded up Moses to deliver his people - but in reality, God did all the work." "People just couldn't get things right. Thankfully, God was still not done saving his people." "It was God's way of saying, "I'll take care of the rescuing. Just trust me." "This time God was going to do everything himself, to make sure Abraham got his blessing." "Our story is the story of God doing what we can't, in order to make up for us doing what we shouldn't." "God kicks his own people out of Paradise and then does whatever it takes to bring them back again." "The Snake Crusher is coming back again to wipe away all the bad guys and wipe away every tear. Truly this is the Best Story ever!"

Find any excuse you can to purchase "The Biggest Story" for yourself and everyone you know. "The Biggest Story" is marketed as a children's storybook but it really "leads kids AND parents alike on an exciting journey through the Bible, connecting the dots from the garden of Eden to Christ's death on the cross to the new heaven and new earth." as stated on the fly-leaf. The text focuses on the overarching theme of God's salvation plan as revealed throughout the Bible. This is not the storybook to teach the details of the various Bible stories (how many animals boarded the Ark, where did God give the commandments, etc.) but some of the details can be spotted in the artwork throughout the book (for example the golden calf and the giant Goliath). I love how many of the important stories are summarized in just a few words. An example from part of one page (a page that happens to actually have a fair amount of text): "God sent prophets (but Israel didn't listen). God

provided priests (but the priests didn't know how to be holy).Later, God gave them kings (but the kings were a royal pain).Israel was a mess."There truly is something for everyone in this storybook and you (and your kids) will want to read it over and over.

This book is gorgeous and provides an excellent summary of the overall message of the Bible, that man is separated from God and must be reconciled to Him and evil defeated. It captured my kids' (4 and 3) attention immediately, and we read through the whole thing in one sitting as soon as we had realized it arrived on our doorstep.Firstly, this definitely isn't a story for kids who don't already know the Bible or the Gospel. It's not to be taken as the full gospel by itself, because I feel like there are too many holes. But for children who are familiar with the Bible stories already, this is riveting. Some pros and cons...PROS:- The illustrations are stunning, vivid, and clever in the way they portray the content.- The book takes complicated stories and distills them down into a summary that makes sense and is not long-winded. It makes the story of the Bible clear and easy to take in.- The 10 chapters are short, so it can be read in one sitting if you wish, or broken up into smaller chunks.- For those who avoid pictures of Jesus, this book does not have any - just representations, like a foot on sand, or an outlined figure with a crown of thorns.CONS:- Almost all of the people in the book are bearded men. I recognize that the bulk of Biblical characters are men, but as a woman I think it would have been nice to see more women represented in the art. (The angel with long vivid pink hair is pretty, though!) There ARE more women when you get to the New Testament section, which seems fitting.- I was a little disappointed with the prose, as I was expecting a very lyrical tone, but the prose comes across as more colloquial ("It didn't take long... for Noah to do some pretty bad stuff himself.") It reads like someone telling the story of the Bible verbally, which isn't a BAD thing, and is clever at times - but it wasn't what I expected.- The story gets a little more complicated at the point of the Gospel, less easy for younger children to understand. In a couple of spots there's more emphasis on being clever and unique than being readily understandable. ("We live in the beginning of the end of the story that we are still in the middle of"....what?)One reviewer commented that the snake is never actually crushed in the story. You DO see it severed in two on the back cover, and the text explains that one day the Snake Crusher is coming back again to destroy the bad guys once and for all (which is true...after all, Satan is still at work right now). I did have to explain this to my kids again afterward, so perhaps it is not too clear in the text Again, I don't think this stands alone, but should be supplementary to actual Scripture, good teaching, and good Bible storybooks. Taken in that way, this book is beautiful, and a great addition to a family library, for kids 4-5 and up - and adults too!
