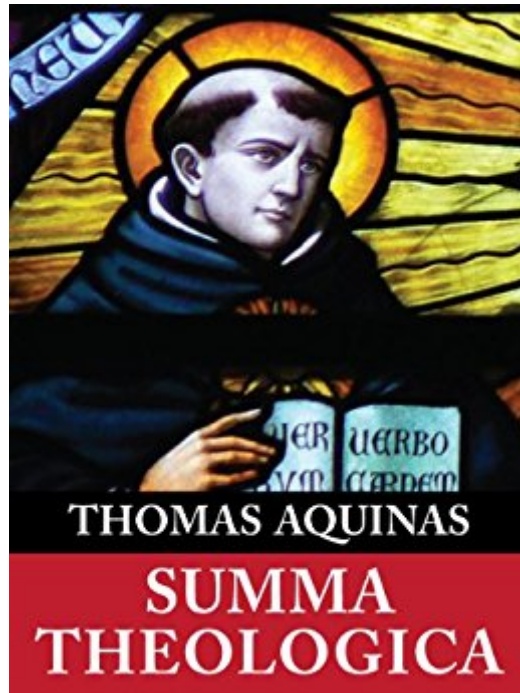

Synopsis

The Summa Theologica (Latin: "Summary of Theology" or "Highest Theology") is the most famous work of Thomas Aquinas (1225–1274). It was intended as a manual for beginners as a compilation of all of the main theological teachings of the time. It summarizes the reasoning of all points of Christian theology, which before the Protestant Reformation subsisted solely in the Roman Catholic Church. The Summa's topics follow a cycle: the existence of God; God's creation, Man; Man's purpose; Christ; the Sacraments; and back to God. It is famous for its five arguments for the existence of God, the Quinque viae (Latin: five ways). Throughout his work, Aquinas cites Augustine of Hippo, Aristotle, and other Christian, Jewish, Muslim and ancient pagan scholars. This is an electronic edition of the complete book and includes an author biography. This book features a table of contents linked to every chapter.

Dialogue for him was to reach the point of view of others . That makes him modern, necessary today to learn not only about the main theological themes but to use his method to get new paths of the faith trying to understand.

As high an intellect as St. Augustine and as discerning as Thomas More; Summa Theologica will bring insights and conviction of the Catholic faith with arguments that can't be rebutted. The depth of thought is inspiring and the fortitude brings the reader to humble beginnings wanting to read it over and over.

If you want to know, from reason, about anything important, read Thomas Aquinas. The Enlightenment dispensed with his scholasticism, to our peril. You need to be acquainted with this great saint. Aquinas' thoughts were replete in the writings of the great thinkers; he was their link to Aristotle. For example, read the Summa articles TREATISE ON THE CONSERVATION AND GOVERNMENT OF CREATURES (QQ. 103-119) then read THE FEDERALIST PAPERS, George Washington's "Farewell Address." These are just a few of the works of the great minds of America's founders that were undoubtedly influenced by Aquinas' SUMMA THEOLOGICA.

Hard work but be patient

This highly respected classic was the pivotal work in reconciling Aristotelian logic and metaphysics with Christian doctrine and still holds a privileged place in the theological canon of the Roman Catholic church. Reviewing the Summa is like reviewing Beethoven's Eighth Symphony or the Parthenon. It is outside the corpus of the reviewable, a standard reference for small cadre of natural theologians.

The Bible citations come from the King James translation. Now, for those of you who like it fine, but it should be noted that the KJV came four hundred years after Aquinas (i.e. he never saw it) and about five hundred years before me. Better and more up-to date translations are available. After all, the only way this work matters (and the Bible as well) is how well it presents the Gospel to you. But I give it five stars for the price!
